

Michela Comba is Associate Professor at the Department of Architecture and Design (DAD) of the Politecnico di Torino, where she teaches History of Architecture. She is also a member of the faculty of the Doctoral School of History and Design (DASP) and of the Construction History Group. She has been the science supervisor of the DAD research projects on the former Fiat Engineering archive (Evolve, Maire Tecnimont Foundation) since 2012. She is a scholar of Carlo Mollino and has published with Bollati Boringhieri, Electa, Silvana Editoriale, Zanichelli and Il Mulino. She has collaborated with *Il Giornale dell'Architettura* (2004-2011). She took part in the project *La concezione strutturale. Ingegneria e Architettura in Italia negli anni cinquanta e sessanta* (PRIN 2008-2013). She co-curated the exhibition *Carlo Mollino architetto* (Archivio di Stato di Torino 1/10-23/12/2006) with C.
